

First pan-European shoreline-migration map since 2004



Knowing how, and at what rate, our coasts are changing is the first step to successfully managing them. The new **EMODnet Geology shoreline-migration map** allows users to visualise pan-European coastal behaviour for 2007-2017 at different spatial scales. A built-in search and zoom functionality allow online users to distinguish areas of landward migration (erosion or submergence), stability, and seaward migration (accretion or emergence). The underlying, downloadable satellite-based dataset offers additional information on annual


