Together, the European Marine Observation and Data Network (EMODnet) and the National Marine Data and Information Service of China (NMDIS) have created two sister projects. Based in the EU and China, these are known, respectively, as the EMODnet Partnership for China and Europe (EMOD-PACE) and the China-EU Marine Data Network Partnership (CEMDnet).

... WHAT WE ARE DOING

We are collaborating to make marine knowledge more accessible by improving the interoperability of data and data information systems between the EU and China, the accessibility and use of ocean observations and data, as well as the generation of added value data products. By sharing and facilitating access to marine observation data and expert knowledge, developing novel information products and establishing new and strengthening existing relationships between Europe, China and other Asian countries we will contribute to:

- Improving our knowledge of the behaviour of the sea;
- Promoting international ocean governance, as a key contribution to the UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development;
- Reducing uncertainty-driven risk and stimulating sustainable maritime productivity in Europe and Asia.

Having consolidated our partnership, we now want to encourage other interested data initiatives and data centres to **join the movement** so we can share the lessons learned, **pooling our knowledge**, infrastructure, services, and data resources for the **benefit of the global community**!

The EU values this ongoing and strengthening partnership with China that is already seeing results in improved marine data sharing, interoperability and new knowledge. 


- **Learning from and sharing expertise** with colleagues from Europe, China and other Asian countries, benefiting from best practices and lessons-learned, on;
